If this is not excluded, then the guideline needs significant additions in relation to the provision of information and support to bereaved relatives.

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2	Fukk	129-133		The section on information and support to families and carers does not include guidance on the sort of support that will be needed if the patient dies. If this is a deliberate exclusion, then it would be helpful to make this explicit, and state somewhere in the guideline which alternative NICE guidance covers this. If this is not deliberate, then the guideline will need to be expanded to include this.
